The First Commandment

You shall have no other gods. *What does this mean?* We should fear, love, and trust in God above all things.

The First Commandment is the greatest. My encounter with it will determine whether I shall try to satisfy myself with pseudojoys or be crushed, raised, and then rendered joyful by the timeless and profound joy of the one eternal God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Who or what shall be my god? To whom or what shall I look for blessing, confidence, security? What do I desire? What do I fear? What do I love? What do I trust? All the Commandments are bound together in this First. That's why Luther begins the explanation of each with, "We should fear, love, and trust in God so that . . ." Each of the Commandments follows the First in laying bare and mercilessly condemning our common idols and gods.

What does it mean to have a god? Or, what is God? Answer: A god means that from which we are to expect all good and in which we are to take refuge in all distress. So, to have a God is nothing other than trusting and believing Him with the heart. I have often said that the confidence and faith of the heart alone make both God and an idol. If your faith and trust is right, then your god is also true. On the other hand, if your trust is false and wrong, then you do not have the true God. For these two belong together, faith and God [Hebrews 11:6]. Now I say that whatever you set your heart on and put your trust in is truly your god. (Large Catechism I 2-3)

False gods offer false joys. Idols are infinite. Like a thousand local gods, or the pantheon of the ancient Greeks or modern Hindus, the plethora of idolatrous possibilities beckons the unwary sinner and would-be saint. "He who has money and possessions feels secure and is joyful and undismayed as though he were sitting in the midst of paradise. . . This care and desire for money sticks and clings to our nature, right up to the grave" (LC I 7, 9). Great point, Luther. "For we brought nothing into the world, and we cannot take anything out of the world" (1 Timothy 6:7; see Job 1:21; Ecclesiastes 5:15). Infinite are the stories of joyless millionaires. But we're all in the same boat. I've seen obscene greed most virulent in unscrupulous beggars. I should be a fool and a liar to deny my own wretchedness. Money makes a very poor god. It has to be locked up and protected and worried about!

Shall your idol be "skill, prudence, power, favor, friendship, and honor" (LC I 10)? Shall your idols follow the pattern of the Ten Commandments—name and recognition? Adulation? Power? Strength? Fear of failing health? Sex? Lust for what's not your's? Reputation at the expense of others? Being the one who knows the scuttle? Desire for things? They all promise joy. Shall your idols be your presumed holiness? Your sanctity? Your religiosity? Your sanctimonious self-righteousness? The "pleasure" is short-lived. The fix is fleeting. The addictions remain unsatisfied. The gods are false. They are blind, deaf, and dumb. They hear no prayers. The consolation is illusory. They die with us.

Why Am I Joy: Fully Lutheran? Because Jesus kept the First Commandment for me. He suffered my just punishment for all my sins against the First Commandment. Freed from the results of my own sin, freed from eternal death and the devil, freed from idolatry, I rejoice! "Restore to me the joy of Your salvation and uphold me with a willing spirit" (Psalm 51:12). And finally, freed from idolatrous abuse of all that is no God, I can use and enjoy God's wonderful creation not as fake god, the objects of my fear, love, and trust, but precisely as joyous gifts.¹

From the beginning of time, God has had a plan to be in relationship with us human beings. We were created in His image and given a position as the caretakers of the earth. But Satan deceived Adam and Eve and they disobeyed God. Sin had entered the world; nothing would ever be the same again. However, God's plan has not changed, He still desires to be in a relationship with us, His created human beings. The Bible tells us that story, the story of God's desire and attempts to restore our relationship with Him, even when He is rejected, and cursed, and ignored, and despised. Even though sin has a hold on us and blinds us to the truth, God still reaches out to us with His love and forgiveness. God loved us so much that HE came into our world as one of us, to live and die, to break the power of sin, death, and the devil, so we could once again be free to be in relationship with Him.

In Vacation Bible School this summer, the children will be looking into God's Holy Word, the Bible, to discover God's miraculous mission to save you, me, and the whole world! In the five Bible stories that we will focus on, we will learn how God has been on a mission to save us from sin. First, we will learn how God made the universe; second, we will learn of God's promise of a Savior to Abram; third, we will learn how God fulfilled that promise in the birth of Jesus, our Savior; fourth, we will learn how Jesus defeated sin, death, and the devil through His own death and resurrection; and on day five we will learn how Jesus ascended into heaven where He is preparing a place for us to someday be with Him for eternity.

Miraculous Mission VBS will have a "space adventure" feel to the program. We will have "Starry Night Storytelling; Observation Station Bible Challenge; Blastoff Games; Wonderful Creation Crafts; and Galaxy Snacks (incorporated into the light meal that will be served at 5:30pm just prior to the beginning of the program). Oh, and of course there will be music during both the opening and closing programs every night. It's going to be a "BLAST, or maybe I should say..."3... 2... 1... BLASTOFF", to discover God's mission for us.

President Carol Prozinski called the meeting to order at 6:35 p.m. The meeting opened with a reading by Don Stover. In attendance were Pastor Gary Hendrickson, DCO Peter Keyes, Don Stover, Nancy Christensen, Nancy Peterson, Ben Messinger, Sheldon Prozinski, Carol Prozinski, Marlyn Poppen, and Bev Messinger.

Motion made by Don Stover and seconded by Marlyn Poppen to approve the agenda as written; motion carried.

Motion made by Nancy Peterson and seconded by Don Stover to approve the minutes of the last meeting (March 11, 2019) as written; motion carried.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Hendrickson reported:

1. During the previous month (March), there were **no** baptisms, confirmations, funerals, marriages, releases, transfers, nor professions of faith.
2. **Calls:** Twenty-two (22) calls to homebound members. There were no hospital/member visitations this month.
3. **Junior Confirmation:** Madison & McKenzie Bates, Patrick Holtz, and Jordan Stumpf have completed all the requirements to be confirmed on Palm Sunday, April 14. Barb Johnson will order their confirmation flowers. Kayla Bates will arrange to have all the young folks robe up and ready for pictures by 8:30 a.m. on April 14. Barb Johnson will be taking the group and individual pictures for this year's confirmation class.
4. **Polka Praise Service:** The next one will be on **May 26, 2019**. There will be a "Brats & other Goodies Feed" following the service. We also have the musicians reserved for **September 22, 2019**.
5. **Pastors' Circuit Meeting:** We met this past week at Messiah in Sartell. We'll meet next month, **May 13-15**, at Madden's Resort for our Minnesota State Pastoral Conference.
6. **Adult Confirmation Class:** I plan to begin the next class on Tuesday, April 30, at 6:30 p.m. Two ladies have indicated definite interest in attending this class.
7. **Pre-Marriage Class:**
 - a. Derek Lipke & Alyssa Cogswell will complete this class on Thursday, April 11. They plan to be married at Zion on Saturday, **June 8**, at 3:00 p.m. Due to facilities conflicts with Vacation Bible School, their wedding rehearsal has been scheduled for Sunday, **June 2**, about 11:00 a.m.
 - b. Randi Graves & Mark Chock have completed the pre-marriage questionnaire. I won't be meeting again with them until Saturday, April 27, following the evening service. They don't have any firm plans yet for a date to be married.

DCO REPORT: Director of Christian Outreach, Peter Keyes, reported he had been involved in many community events in March.

TREASURER'S REPORT Don Stover reported:

Operating Account

1. Income vs. Expenses for March = positive \$3,104. Offering income benefited by March being a five Sunday month and the added income resulting from Ash Wednesday and Lenten offerings.
2. Income vs. Expenses year-to-date = positive \$3,648. Expenses in general have been low as certain budgeted projects have yet to be incurred.
3. Grounds maintenance included snow plowing in the amount of \$293.
4. Church Repair and Maintenance included quarterly fire alarm monitoring for \$120. In addition, during the month, one of the church's sewer lines froze. There was minimal damage to church property (replacement ceiling tiles and furnace filter in storage), but expenses incurred to clear out the line. In total, there was \$753 of damage or expenses. There was \$430 charged to Church Repairs and Maintenance in March. There was \$148 recorded in extra janitorial costs related to cleanup and the clearing of the line.
5. Gas (heat) was a large expense during the month at \$1,499.

Building Fund

1. The March loan payment of \$3,742.18 was comprised of \$1,191.44 of principal reduction and \$2,550.74 of interest. The Building Loan at the end of March was \$788,715.
2. The Building Fund investment deposit with the Lutheran Church Extension Fund (LCEF) at the end of March was \$35,036.
3. Building Fund income during March was \$4,124.79. This is comprised of:
 - a. Offerings (5 Sundays) = \$2,062
 - b. Memorials – none received
 - c. Thrivent Choice Dollars = \$48 *Thank you for your designations!!!*
 - d. Chicks for Bricks dinner = \$1,747
 - e. ZLW soup meal = \$242
 - f. Interest Income = \$25.79

Revolving Funds

1. The March Door Offering for The Morrison County Food Shelf totaled \$482.01. In total, there was \$961.01 given to the food shelf as \$300 from the February Ground Hog dinner was donated as well as \$179 from the Lenten meal that was served by the Elders.
2. The Youth Fund had net transfer out of \$174 as offering income and water-park trip reimbursements that totaled \$711 were offset by \$885.04 of disbursements for the water-part event, escape room event, and Minnesota North District event fee and t-shirts.
3. Altar Flowers account balance = \$245
4. Lutheran Witness subscription balance = \$137.08
5. Evangelism Lenten supper meal proceeds (\$232) was designated for the Puerto Rico mission.

BOARD REPORTS

BOARD OF ELDERS: Sheldon Prozinski reported:

1. There will be communion on Palm Sunday due to confirmation. A cake is being ordered and served for confirmands April 14. It will be purchased with extra Thrivent Action card funds.
2. Palms were ordered.
3. Baptism on August 4 will be conducted by Pastor Carnicom as Pastor Hendrickson will be on vacation.

TRUSTEES: Ben Messinger reported:

1. Trustees met tonight – Keith Schumann will get a quote for the handrail on the east side of the Fellowship Hall.
2. I will get with Barb about ordering batteries for the thermostats.
3. I also checked with Central Minnesota Electric (CME) about the entry lights – their estimate is \$118 per light. Since we need eight (8) lights, they will get us a final quote before we move ahead with the project.
4. The quote for an AED (heart de-fibrillator) to be installed would cost \$1800, plus maintenance and training. Gold Cross and the Police did not see this as beneficial since they are only a few blocks away, and their personnel are already trained. Therefore, the Trustees recommended not pursuing this item.
5. Roof repairs are to be determined. Earl, from Contegrity Group, will be on site when this is done
6. Keith Schumann will replace the O-ring in the water heater.

YOUTH AND EDUCATION: DCO Peter Keys reported (Amanda Dawson submitted information):

Sunday School

1. Vacation Bible School (VBS) material is here and being reviewed.
2. Sunday School has had inconsistent attendance.
 - a. The children will sing **May 19** – this is also the last day of Sunday School before summer.
 - b. We discussed ways to revamp Sunday School for next year – maybe a VBS kick-off on May 19, maybe a picnic on May 19?
 - c. We will have a bake sale the last day of Sunday School. Katie will look into getting a Thrivent Card.
 - d. No Sunday School on Easter Sunday (April 21).
 - e. A cake will be served on confirmation Sunday. Katie Schumann will get cards and gift certificates for confirmands and graduates.
3. Barb is still looking to step down from Sunday School Superintendent if anyone is interested.

Youth

2. Easter breakfast menu and shopping list is ready. Kids are being asked to come immediately following sunrise service to serve and clean up.”*

4. Youth Gathering - Linda Dickmann went to a leadership training event; she will bring ideas to discuss at the May meeting.
5. Center Shot Ministry Program seems to have enough members and DCO Peter Keyes will be scheduling a meeting.
6. Pastor Hendrickson noted there were going to be two (2) services for Easter (Sunrise at 6:30 a.m. and 9:00 a.m.)
7. Next Youth & Education meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, May 7, 6:30 p.m.

EVANGELISM: Nancy Christensen reported:

1. Evangelism committee met April 1 with seven (7) members present and I reported on chapter 4 of “Becoming a Welcoming Church”. We had many questions and will get them to Carol Prozinski to be added to a questionnaire she is planning to distribute to all Zion members.
2. Evangelism board voted to purchase an easel to direct attendees to events within the building. DCO Peter Keyes mentioned he has an easel that can be used (no need to purchase).
